Many young people that engaged at Code 7 in 2019 were from a variety of challenging backgrounds but it was pleasing to witness a high percentage of the 250 young people that engaged, progressed in some form; from music production to music marketing and from office filing to learning how to write applications.

A special shout goes out to Code 7's Strategic team who have assisted in the launch of Lambeth Schools Patrol. This volunteer project will be a positive game changer in the Lambeth community and beyond.
