### 1. Key Findings

- 1) A high percentage of young people who were not really interested in music-based activities utilised Code 7 for the support entity;
- 2) Police relied heavily on Code 7's services;
- 3) Young people respected other young people from different areas all because they met while doing similar activities in Code 7;
- 4) Local shop keepers declined from calling the police and asked for our support in dealing with certain young people;
- 5) Young males are more happier to record positive lyrics whereas before they were very reluctant;
- 6) Young females were motivated when first enrolling at Code 7 but with time all need continuous encouragement because of the day to day issues they face outside;
- 7) Young people are still finding it difficult and many are afraid to travel out of their areas with fear of other young people attacking them.

Research was done by means of; questionnaires, question & answer sessions, observation, one-on-ones, open discussion and product/project/young people assessments.



#### 2. Measurable Outcomes

- √ Employed 6 staff, 12 facilitators and a floatation of 20 volunteers;
- √ Evidenced by means of sign in sheets, Code 7 and the resident organisations operating at Offley Works generated a turnover of **19,000 people** between January and December 2010;
- √ Engaged **603** young people over the year 2010 in projects and programmes;
- $\sqrt{72}$  were new registrations;
- $\sqrt{527}$  were males 76 were females;
- $\sqrt{247}$  = SW9 | 95 = SW2 | 11 = SE11 | 8 = SE15 | 101 = Kennington | 20 = Stockwell | 9 = SE16 | 14 = SE19 | 2 = SE27 | 1 = SW12 | 10 = SW8 | 21 = Brixton | 15 = Streatham | 29 = Clapham | 20 = E5
- √ Code 7 delivered our yearly portable workshops in Music, Drama, Video and Beauty for the Lambeth Summer Projects Trust for 4 weeks and engaged **200** young people;
- √ Code 7 took on **28** young people on work experience from various schools;
- √ Code 7 took on **12** young people on work placements from job search agencies;
- √ Code 7 completed **20** written references to help gain employment and further education for **20** young people;
- $\sqrt{\text{Code 7 guided 10 people into part time or full time employment;}}$



### 3. Achievements/Progress for the Year

- ➤ Code 7 are into the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of a 3-year contract awarded from the BBC Children In Need;
- ➤ Code 7 secured funding from Lambeth Youth Opportunities Fund for our film 'Two Ways To Life';
- ➤ Code 7's Youth Committee is continuing to develop with 20 regular members;
- ➤ Code 7's CEO and a young project leader gave an interview about Code 7 on BBC Breakfast News;
- ➤ BBC Children in Need invited Code 7's youngers to Strictly Come Dancing on TV;
- ➤ BBC Children in Need invited Code 7's youngers to their Appeal Day at BBC TV Studios;
